Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) 4/17/2020 Community Update

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is closely monitoring the COVID-19 outbreak. As of 04/17/2020, Idaho is reporting 1,609 cases of COVID-19. The Panhandle Health District (Northern Idaho) is reporting 53 cases (4 cases in Bonner County, 49 in Kootenai County)

What is BCH doing to prevent the spread of COVID-19?

- Incident Command is set-up
- One Point of Entrance for everyone (ER Side Entrance)
- Everyone will have their temperature taken & asked a series of questions prior to entering the building
- "NO Visitor" policy is in place (exceptions for end of life care & minors)
- Elective Procedures on hold at this time
- Clinic visits limited. Implemented Call-in Clinic & utilizing Telemedicine
- ER still seeing patients, open 24/7/365
- ER triage and curb-side COVID testing
- Inventory of our PPE is being done daily
- The kitchen is serving food on a grab and go basis or curb side service
- Communication with Benewah County Emergency Office Center is operational
- Meetings with Governor and Region 1 Healthcare Coalition weekly
- Cancellation of most meetings. Some meetings being conducted via conference line
- Requiring staff to follow stay home order or self-quarantine for 14 days
- Social Distancing remain 6 feet away from others
